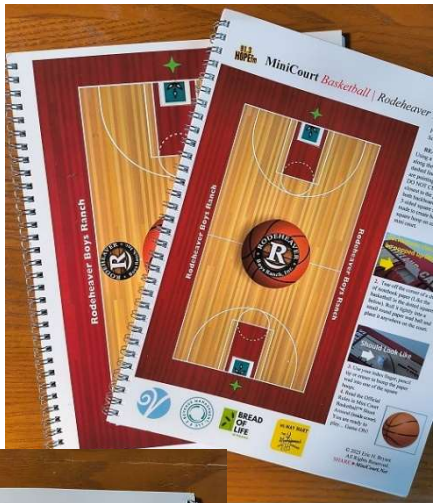


Case Study #153 | “City Edition” evolution in Palatka, FL
